

THE POWER OF NEGATIVE THINKING

It is interesting how some gullible believers can fall for a heretical Bible interpretation that infers a negative from a positive promise. Nevertheless, gullibility is a modern Christian trait. And even during the time of the early believers, it was said of them that the children of this world were wiser.

Gullibility and the Church of Christ or Campbellites

And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. **He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned.** -- Mark 16:15, 16

Church of Christ Campbellites infer that if you are not baptized, you will be lost and go to hell, since he that believeth and is baptized is promised that he shall be saved. Therefore, he that is not baptized shall be damned, despite the fact that it only says that he that believeth not shall be damned.

Gullibility in the Short Liver Society

Honour thy father and thy mother: that **thy days may be long upon the land** which the LORD thy God giveth thee. -- Ex. 20:12

Honour thy father and mother; (which is the **first commandment with promise** ;) --Eph. 6:2

My son, forget not my law; but let thine heart keep my commandments: For **length of days, and long life, and peace, shall they add to thee.** --Prov. 3:1, 2

By the same token of negative thinking, because that obedience to parents is connected to the promise of long life, shall we infer from this that those do so, who die early, because they have disobeyed their parents? Or shall we infer that all those who live to their nineties have all obeyed their parents? Or shall we infer that all the babies that Herod slaughtered, were slaughtered at an early age because they did not keep God's commandments, which carry a promise of length of days and long life?

Gullibility and the Faustites and Overcomer's Cult

He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches; He that overcometh **shall not be hurt of the second death . . . Blessed and holy** is he that hath part in the **first resurrection:** on such **the second death hath no power,** but they shall be priests of God and of Christ, and shall **REIGN** with him a thousand years. -- Rev. 2:11; 20:6

It is the same type of negative thinking and interpretation that Heretic Joey Faust uses to deceive folks in that some Christian believers may be hurt by the second death or Lake of Fire, since there is a certain church in Revelation, whose folks are promised not to be hurt by the second death or Lake of Fire. Of course, to make his heretical view stick, Joey Faust must get rid of all the carnal Christians out of the **FIRST** resurrection, for those first resurrection participants are **HOLY** and **BLESSED** and shall be priests of God who shall **REIGN** in the Kingdom for 1000 years. Faust's **KINGDOM EXCLUSION** cannot allow this for carnal believers and must somehow get these carnal, born again believers during the second resurrection at the white throne judgment, even if he does not have any scripture for that.
